



## **MINUTES of the PLENARY MEETING of the PCC 4 November 2020 The meeting was held online.**

### **1. Opening**

The meeting has been chaired by Mr. Tobias Kunst, Chair of AdV, the Working Committee of the Surveying Authorities of the Laender of the Federal Republic of Germany, on behalf of the German Presidency of the PCC.

The Plenary of the PCC is attended by the representatives of the members and observers of the PCC. Members of the PCC are the Cadastral Institutions of the EU Member States. According to the Statute the quorum for a plenary requires the presence of at least ten members. With a total of 27 EU Member States being represented, this provision of the statute has been fulfilled.

### **2. Admission of observers**

Her Majesty's Land Registry through Mr Gareth Robson, Interim Head of Data Group, Data Group – Digital, Data and Technology, Her Majesty's Land Registry, Plymouth has applied to be admitted as an observer; their application has been sent by email. As "No objection" from the members was recorded, Her Majesty's Land Registry was admitted as an observer of the PCC.

### **3. The Report on the German Presidency of the PCC**

Mr. Marcus Wandinger, Secretary General of AdV, highlighted the most important outcomes of the German PCC Presidency. Due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic the conference was organised virtually with technical support kindly provided by EuroGeographics and provided the participants with the opportunity to follow a wide range of interesting presentations that all showed the importance that cadastral and land registry systems play in the context of sustainable development. During the German PCC presidency, PCC jointly with EuroGeographics' CLRKEN have prepared a survey which has been sent to all PCC member countries. The aim of the survey was to assess the relationship between the Sustainable Development Goals as laid out by the United Nations and cadastre & land registries. The results of the questionnaire were presented during the virtual PCC conference by Mr. Daniel Steudler, Chair of CLRKEN. The official version of the result of the questionnaire and all presentations from this webinar shall be available on the PCC and EuroGeographics web pages.

### **4. Introduction to the Portuguese Presidency of PCC**

The next country to chair the PCC is Portugal. The Portuguese representatives, Mrs. Fernanda do Carmo, Director-General of the Directorate General for Territory, has introduced the next presidency actions and informed the participants that the next Conference and Plenary Meeting of PCC will be organized in cooperation with EuroGeographics as an online event which will take place in May 2021.
