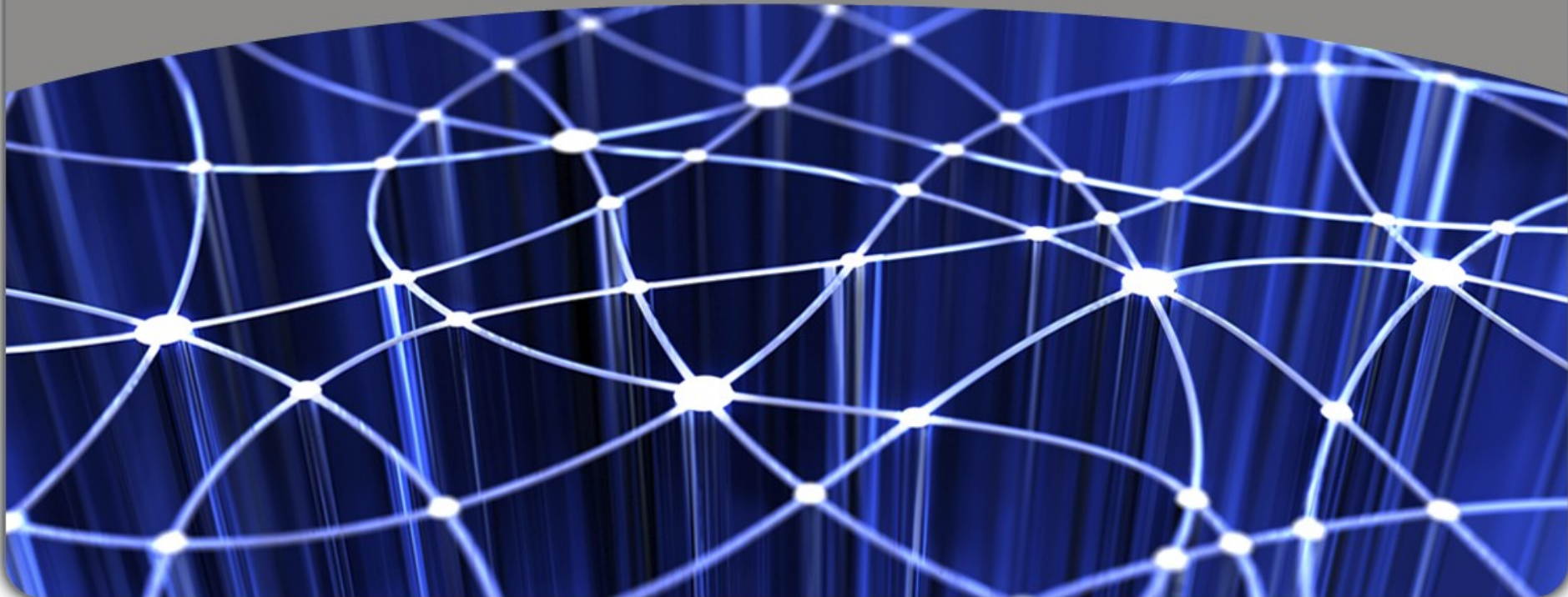

The present vision statement

Cadastre and Land Registration in Europe 2012

- Providing *State of the Art Services* to the Real property Market and market for land information *integrated within e-government* and co-operating in the building of the *National and European Spatial Data Infrastructures*

Why a new Vision ?

- Substantial changes in society since the vision statement was set up
 - Growing expectations from the users to the provided services
 - Development in e-government
 - INSPIRE contributing to building of N/ESDIs
 - EU initiatives like the Certificate on Inheritance
- **Cadastral and Land Registry Organisations need to adapt to these changes...**

Vision starting point

General developments in society until 2017:

- *Our business will be **more driven by users** and general developments in society **than technology***
- ***European developments** are becoming more important, **directly affecting** the way we operate*
- ***Need for** increased efficiency, better services for less and new demands from citizens and business means that government organisations at different levels will need to find **new ways to work together**. This might also mean that some organisations are given a defining leading role, and that we let other organisations handle support services, etc.*

- Which added value can – and will - we provide?
- How to react to the modern ways of the information age?
- Coverage and content of Cadastres and Land Registries
- Relationship between Cadastre and Land Registry
- Financing, fees, subsidies, data copyrights

- Acknowledge that organisation, roles and responsibilities for Cadastre and Land Registry organisations are different from country to country!

New structure of the vision

- Vision statement (one A4 page)
- Background paper
- ppt presentation (statement+background)
- **Based on this**
 - EG C&LR KEN, PCC, ELRA and EULIS can define own workplans
 - Each Cadastre and Land Registry organisation can develop its own strategy
