Dominique Laurent Thematic Working Group of Cadastral Parcel (TWG CP) and Magnus Gudmundsson (President of EuroGeographics) were invited to this meeting.

26th was the technical day with focus on archives issues and European initiatives.

Bozena Lipej presented the developments in Slovenia about geographic information and cadastre.

Then 3 countries (Sweden, Austria and Slovenia) presented their experience about digital archives of cadastral documents.

Slovenia presented more in detail the census of real estate conducted quite recently.

Dominique Laurent presented the activities of TWG CP and invited the meeting members to participate in the testing phase. The following day, she made a little poll to know the countries which might be interested:

- yes: Belgium, Austria, Portugal, Italy, Poland, Sweden, probably Germany
- may be: Czech Republic, Finland
- no: Slovenia.

Ulf Sandgren (Sweden) presented conclusions of the Stockholm meeting about the LADM proposal:

- The document has to be amended quite a lot
 - must be simplified
 - must take INSPIRE and EULIS into account
 - should define procedures to exclude/add other features and attributes

- should give examples in the annexes
- ...
- Can not override national laws
- A calendar has been defined ; final draft expected before Christmas 2008.

Stefan Gustafsson (Sweden) closed the first day by a very interesting presentation of EULIS.

27th was the official day:
